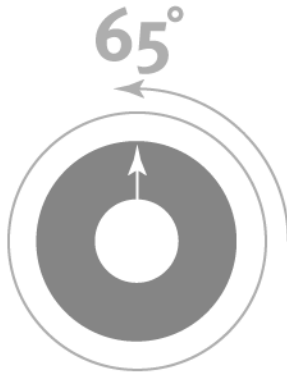
TURN DOWN. SEAL OFF. SAVE UP.

Home heating costs are higher than ever. Combined with increasing food and gas prices, staying warm all through this winter could be very difficult. Pennsylvania is doing everything it can to provide financial help to pay home heating bills and weatherization expenses, but making sure you have the resources to outlast winter starts with you. With a little planning and a little knowledge, you'll be protected from the cold and your heat can last all winter.

TURN DOWN.

Setting your thermostat at 65 degrees during the day and lowering it to 60 degrees when you're not at home or asleep* can save you \$100's a year. If you install a programmable thermostat, it'll take care of that for you automatically. Don't forget your water heater—lowering the temperature to 115 degrees and wrapping it in an insulated blanket designed for water heaters will save you even more.

** Older Pennsylvanians may need to keep their thermostats set at 65 degrees at all times.*

SEAL OFF.

Wasted heat costs everyone. Keep your heat where it's needed by closing heating vents in unused rooms. Make sure any open vents are clean and that furniture isn't blocking them. Install caulking around windows and weather-stripping around exterior doors to help keep the valuable heat inside and the cold outside. Hanging heavy curtains in the winter helps too. Adding insulation also lowers your energy bills and provides a lifetime of savings. You may even qualify for a tax credit. SAVE UP.
